Requirements

Admission requirements for Master's Degree Programmes are valid for Academic Year 2026/2027 and may change in the next Academic Years.

General requirements

You can submit your admission application if:

- You have an Italian title: Bachelor's degree, Master's degree, a Bachelor's degree achieved with the old education system, or a university diploma in compliance with the requirements of the specific degree programme;
- If you're about to graduate, you must have acquired 145 credits (CFU), both for students of Politecnico di Milano and for students of other universities (degree to be obtained by the academic calendar deadline);
- You have a valid English language certification (mandatory for the assessment).

Specific requirements for LM-4

- ✓ **Architecture**
 - ✓ **Architectural Design and History**
 - ✓ **Sustainable Architecture and Landscape Design**
-
- A diploma of the class of degree in Architecture L-17 (or of the class 4 former Ministerial Decree 509/1999);
 - Fulfilled the indispensable training activities shown in the table and related to the degree in Architecture L-17, considered a mandatory educational requirement, in accordance with EEC Directive 85/384 and its recommendations;
 - Having passed the entrance test required for enrolling in L-17 Study Programme (Architectural Design) and/or single-cycle Master's degree, explicitly finalised for "architect training", as regulated at national level.

Specific requirements LM-3

Landscape Architecture. Land Landscape Heritage

A Bachelor's degree in following classes is required (M.D. 270/04):

- L-17 (Architecture)
 - L-21 (Town, regional and environmental planning)
- as well as of the corresponding classes of the Ministerial Decree 509/99

Also, graduate students in the following classes, after their career study verification, can be admitted:

- L-25 (Agricultural and Forestry Sciences and Technologies)
- L-7 (Civil and environmental engineering)
- L-32 (Science and technology for the environment and territory)
- L-4 (Industrial design)
- L-6 (Geography)
- L-1 (Cultural heritage)
- L-3 (Discipline of fine, performing and fashion arts)

as well as of the corresponding classes of the Ministerial Decree 509/99.

Specific requirements for LM-48

Urban Planning and Policy Design - Pianificazione Urbana e Politiche Territoriali

For graduate students from Degree Classes:

- L-17 (Sciences for Architecture)
- L-21 (Town, regional and environmental planning)

Admission is allowed without training debts.

Admission is also allowed to graduates holding a bachelor's degree or a university degree of three years. They are recognized as eligible, subject to prior career assessment and possible assignment of curricular supplements.

Requirements: english language

To access the Master's Degree courses of the Politecnico di Milano, students must demonstrate their knowledge of English language by submitting one of the language certifications recognized at a predetermined level. The knowledge of the English language for the Master's degree courses of the AUIC School is mandatory for assessment.

WARNING: Students who have not obtained the English requirement by the time of the application will not be evaluated.

Requirements: english language

It is possible to self-certify the knowledge of the English language at the required level and upload the certification, if already in your possession, or a certificate that proves the result of the test with the scores required at the same time as the application for admission.

After enrolment you will be contacted to submit the original language certification to the <https://www.polimi.it/en/current-students/desks-and-offices-for-students> or via the Teams platform.

The Registrar's Office reserves the right to request at any time the displaying of the original certificate in presence or distance.

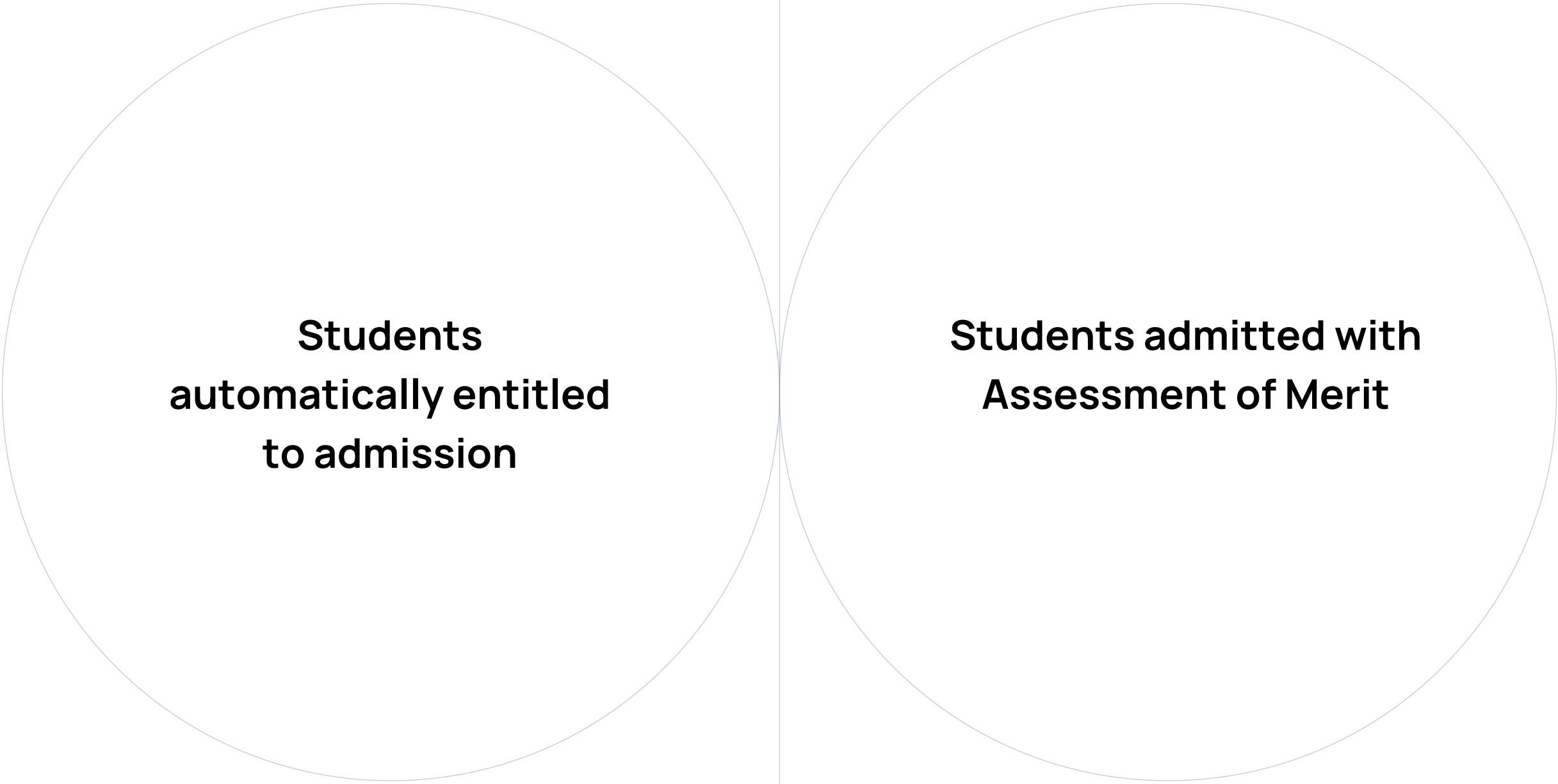
All the candidates for admission in Master's degree Programmes of School of Architecture, Urban Planning and Construction Engineering must apply online.

Undergraduate students will be allowed to apply for admission if they have passed their exams for at least 145 credits by the application deadline; they will be required to graduate by the dates specified in the academic calendar.

Students automatically entitled to admission

- Students at Politecnico di Milano that meet specific parameters N/V defined by each Master's Degree programme

1. Students automatically entitled to admission

Are automatically entitled to admission to their first-choice Study Programme students who have gained (or are about to) a Bachelor's degree in accordance with the admission requirements from the Politecnico di Milano, and who:

- graduated within 4 years of their initial enrolment;
- have a fulfilled N/V parameter* by October 10th of the second calendar year after their initial enrolment;
- hold an English language certification by the established deadline.

No document should be attached to the career assessment application.

*The N and V parameters (number of ECTS and average) required can be found in the student's Study Plan. These may vary depending on the Master's degree Programme applied for.

Admission to Master's degree Programmes of degree class LM-4 is not permitted for graduate students in degree class L-21 and L-23, even with a fulfilled N/V parameter, or from other non-compliant degree categories.

AUIC school – AUIC Arch

Parameters N and V

- Parameter N = Earned credits ≥ 104
- Parameter V = Weight average ≥ 27
- Years within which to graduate ≤ 4

Parameters valid for students enrolled up to the 2024/25 academic year: N/V 104/27

These N and V parameters are valid only for students of the AUIC School who apply for a Master's Degree in accordance with the admission requirements as specified in the Educational Rules.

There is no direct admission on any of the Study Programmes of the School of Architecture Urban Planning Construction Engineering for students from other Schools or other Universities.

Candidates for admission

Students admitted with Assessment of Merit

- Students not automatically entitled to admission
- External students (not graduated at Politecnico di Milano)
- Students admitted with curricular supplements
- Students transferred from another Master's Degree Programme

2. Students admitted with Assessment of Merit

Students who are not automatically entitled to admission (graduates and undergraduates), students outside the Politecnico, students transferred from another Master's Degree Programme (coming from the Politecnico or other University) are subject to a merit assessment.

Graduands candidates of the Politecnico Courses:

For students enrolled in one of the Politecnico Study

Programmes: **For the admission application:**

- Students are considered graduands when they have a complete study plan (180 cfu) and has acquired at **least 145 credits** as effective (excluding the final exam).

For the definition of the ranking:

- Students graduating from the Politecnico di Milano, to be included in the ranking of merit, must have obtained a **number of credits equal to or higher than 172**; only the verbalized exams within the generation of the ranking will be considered.

Graduands candidates

Enrolled with reserve

If you graduate after the enrolment deadline but by:

- **15/12/2026** for access to the Master's degree in the **first semester** 2026/2027
- **01/04/2027** or access to the Master's degree in the **second semester** 2026/2027(only if places are still available)

you will be able to enroll in the Master's degree programme you have been admitted to, even without having already obtained the title, but you will be enrolled **under condition** (students from other Universities will be required to communicate the obtaining of the degree).

If you obtain the title after this deadlines, your registration will be cancelled.

Students will have to respect the regular enrolment deadlines, observing the academic calendar deadlines.

When

Candidates for Master's Degree admission can apply for the first semester, submitting their admission following the deadlines stated in the Academic Calendar:

- Application for the first semester: **22/06/2026 – 17/07/2026**
- Results of first phase assessment by: **03/09/2026**
- First phase enrollment by: **07/09/2026**

Any seats not allocated at the entrance of the first semester will be available for the entrance in the second semester. **In case of reaching the scheduled number in the first semester, it will not be possible to submit the application for admission in the second semester.**

How:

The application for admission must be submitted using the appropriate service activated on:

- www.polimi.it "ONLINE SERVICES"
- log in with your credentials (if you need external registration)
- select link: "Admission to the Master's Degree: application, consultation, registration"

Each candidate is given the opportunity to make an application for evaluation on several Master's Degree Programmes, **up to a maximum of three**.

The student who gets more than one admission, can enroll in the degree program that he considers appropriate.

The student can change/ override their choices no later than the deadline for submission of the application for admission.

CdS and track options (PSPA: Previously Approved Study Plan Options)

By submitting the application for admission, one must choose the Study Programme (CdS) and concurrently, **in order of preference, ALL the address options (PSPA)** where applicable;

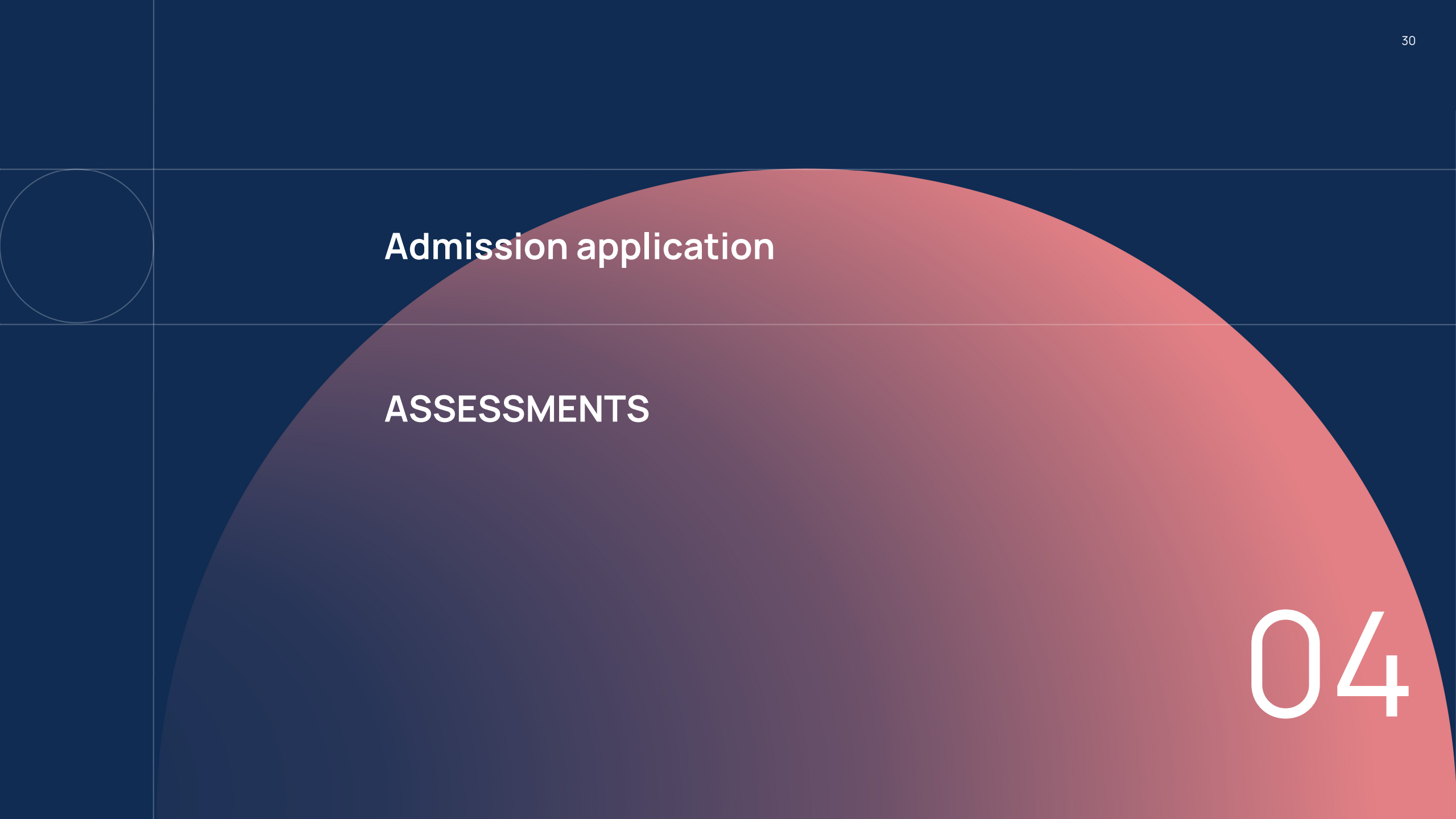
Please note: The PSPA options (e.g. Italian and English) within the same CdS will be counted only once in order to reach the three maximum expressible options.

Assessment parameters

The evaluation of applications for admission, by merit, is entrusted to CdS that have up to 150 points available. **The minimum score to enter the ranking is 100.**

- **up to 110 points** = assessment of the educational curriculum (weighted average of the exams on a basis of at least 145 credits acquired). It will be considered the average of the exams recorded in the Study Plan at the moment of the evaluation.

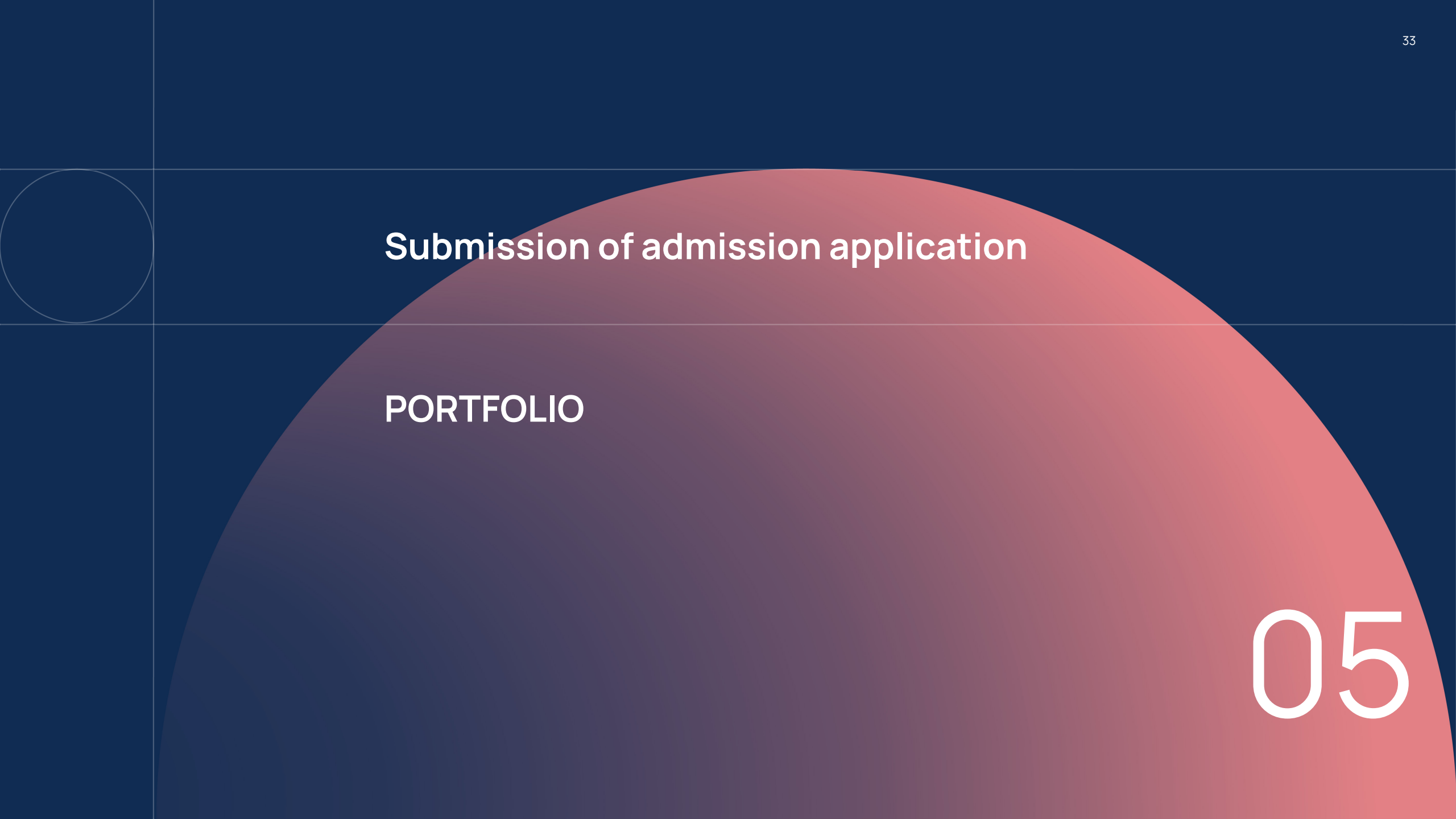
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Assessment parameters

The score for the portfolio is added to the base score; this can be worth up to 40 points, allocated as follows:

- **up to 20 points** = evaluation of the portfolio of works including texts and iconographic material, which will be evaluated according to criteria of originality and consistency of content, formal quality, argumentative and graphic ability, linguistic expression consistent with the Course of Study.
- **Up to 10 points** = evaluation of fully documented internship or extracurricular work experience, certified by companies, relevant and significant for the training of an architect and which have not been used to validate actual credits in the previous career;
- **Up to 10 points** = assessment of other fully documented, relevant and significant extracurricular research or training qualifications for the training of an architect and which have not been used to validate actual credits in the previous career;

The portfolio, in PDF format and no larger than 20MB, must include all the necessary documentation.

TRAINING PROGRAMME

Select the projects from the workshops that are considered most representative.
The committee will assess the number and quality of the selected projects.

Identify a theme that 'organises' the presentation (interpretative framework) and the narrative of the projects presented. Create an **introduction** that explains the theme.
In the **description of the projects**, refer back to the identified theme and describe how the project addresses it.
The committee assesses the appropriateness of language, the ability to present arguments, the quality of...

Create a **clear and consistent** graphic design.
The panel will assess the graphic quality of the designs, the layout – which must enhance the readability and clarity of the presentation – and the adaptation of the designs to fit the graphic layout.

Describe any **extracurricular work** placements and collaborations with firms, or other relevant professional experience.

The panel will assess the duration, relevance to your course of study, and the quality of the work carried out.

TRAINING

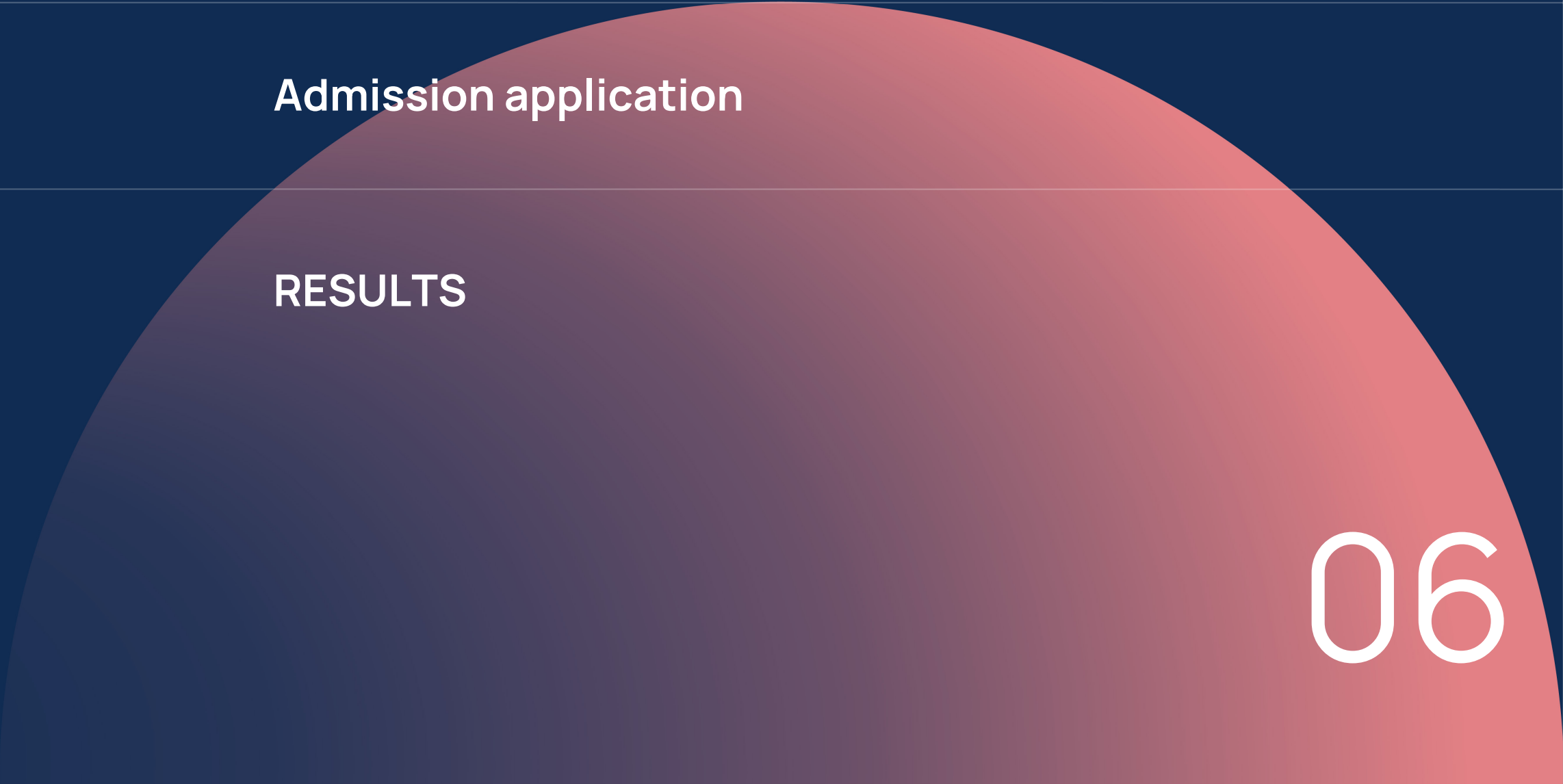
Describe any extracurricular training courses and seminars you have attended.

The committee will assess the duration of the course, the relevance of the content to your course of study, and the quality of the work undertaken.

The committee will only assess activities that are properly documented, bearing a stamp and signature, and accompanied by supporting certificates.

The committee assesses quality on the basis of the visual and textual presentation of the activity carried out.

Ranking and track allocation

Depending on the programmed number for each Study Programme, two merit rankings will be generated at the end of the evaluations:

- for students automatically entitled
- for students admitted by assessment of merit which will determine the admission.

Where multiple tracks are provided, students will be allocated to the choice most advantageous to them, based on the merit ranking.

For those **automatically entitled**, the score will be based on the average of exams passed by the application deadline.

For those **admitted with assessment**, it will be the score assigned by the Boards.

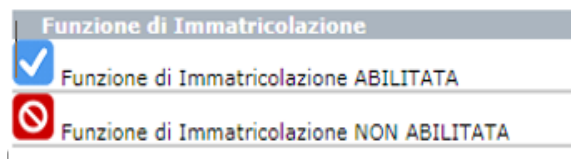
A student may be admitted on only one degree track per CdS.

Students automatically entitled have priority in the allocation of available seats.

Merit ranking list and enrollment

The question has been assessed positively if the check is green.

However, registration will be possible ONLY if the registration function will also be configured in ENABLED mode



The student evaluated positively may therefore **not be admitted to registration due to the depletion of the number of places available** (scheduled number) according to the Ranking that will be published on the website of the School www.auic.polimi.it by the end of the evaluations.

is available from the [Online Services](#) under the heading "Admission to Master's Degree: application submission, consultation and enrolment".

Merit ranking list and enrollment

Scrolling ranking

Places intended for students with an Italian title that may not be used to reach the scheduled number of the Degree Programme will be made available for the scrolling of the relative ranking.

- Results of second phase assessment by: **08/09/2026**
- Second phase enrolment by: **09/09/2026**

For each Study Programme (CdS) **will be excluded from the ranking:**

- students already enrolled in one of the University's CdS (who hasn't specified the will of a simultaneous registration to two Study Programmes)
- students already eligible for enrolment (who have not exercised the right to enroll) to the CdS concerned by the scrolling of the ranking

Students will be considered only once taking into account their highest available option in the scroll rankings.

Students who qualify will be able to enroll and submit a study plan in the period indicated in the academic calendar.

Enrolment

To enroll you must pay the first instalment.

Access the [Online Services](#) and click on the link "Admission to the Master's Degree for graduate students in Italy: application submission, course passage, outcome consultation and enrolment" and enter the magnifying glass on the right of the assessment check. Press the "enroll" button and select the payment method.

Warning: from your personal page on the online services it is necessary to use the 'change matriculation' function and to select the new Master's Degree matriculation number in order to access the related services.

In case of a freshman active on single courses, you can proceed with the withdrawal of studies for the closure of previous matriculation number and then proceed to registration on Master's.

Single courses– Curricular supplements

Curricular supplements

In case of assignment of Curricular supplements (debts), enrolment to the Master's Degree is not allowed.

It is possible to enroll in **single courses** by accepting the outcome of the application for admission to the LM using the appropriate function that will appear in the details of the career assessment.

You can enter a Study Plan of 80 credits maximum per academic year.

The maximum limit of 80 credits per year may include:

- curricular additions assigned by the Commission during career evaluation;
- anticipation of Master's Degree Programme teachings, according to the Educational Rules, for a maximum of 32 credits per year.

Curricular supplements

Enrolment to single courses to fill curricular integrations must be within the terms of matriculation to Master's Degree given by Academic Calendar.

Students admitted with curricular integrations must fulfill them within the academic year to which the assessment relates.

If not fulfilled, one must submit a new application for admission.

Single courses

To deepen personal training

You can enroll in single courses if you want to complement training or for specific cultural interests.

Acceptance of the application for individual courses is subject to availability of places.

You can subscribe to a maximum of 32 credits.

Master's Degrees' single courses purchased before the admission application cannot be included in the portfolio evaluation for the Study Programmes in which single courses are foreseen. They do not grant the student any access privilege.

They can only be validated if they are recognized as equivalent to active teachings in the Master's Degree Programme where the student is enrolling.

Single courses

To deepen personal training

WARNING: the possibility of enrolment to single courses is not guaranteed for all Study Programmes.

In case of Master's Degrees there are limitations for some Degree Programmes. The list of available courses is published on:

Enrolment to single courses lasts only one academic year and allows to attend the teachings as well as taking the exams. After that, a certification can be released.

It is not possible to have two 'single courses' matriculation numbers within the same academic year

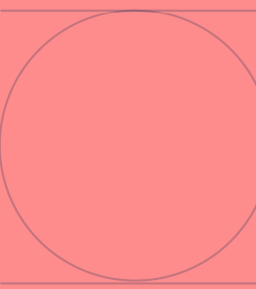
To deepen personal training

Enrolment in Single Courses is **incompatible** with enrolment in Bachelor's, Master's degree programmes and the Old education system, of the Politecnico di Milano or other Italian University.

The amount of fees and contributions to be paid varies according to the total of ECTS purchased as single courses.

Any recognition, by the committees in charge of the evaluation of the CdS, of credits acquired may not exceed 32 credits per career to ensure the overall congruity of the study plan, and is subject:

- to having been eligible in the admission rankings for the specific CdS,
- to the possession of all the pre-requisites provided for access to the specific CdS



Details
